INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARING ABSTRACT

Abstracts should be typed in a 3x7 inch space, such as provided below, and submitted in triplicate. The entire abstract, including title, author(s), institutional affiliation(s), text and acknowledgements must be typed within the rectangle. Single space all typing, leaving no top or left margins. Use blackink for Greek letters and symbols not on your typewriter.

Abstracts will be photographed just as you submit them, so please make neat corrections. Use an electric typewriter, if possible, with a good ribbon. Elite type is preferred. Practice typing the abstract in a 3x7 inch rectangle before using the form below. The lines will be cut away prior to reproduction.

Please send the ORIGINAL PLUS TWO COPIES of your abstract to the Program Officer along with your Transmittal Form.

Your abstract should be organized as follows:

1. A sentence stating the specific objective(s) of the study unless indicated by the title.
2. A brief description of methods, if pertinent.
3. A summary of the results obtained.
4. A statement of conclusions.

CHANGE IN GEOGRAPHIC COVERAGE FOR EDITORS OF ANIMAL BEHAVIOUR: The Editors of ANIMAL BEHAVIOUR announce a change in geographic coverage, effective immediately. Heretofore, the Editor of the Animal Behavior Society ("American" Editor) has received manuscripts only from the United States and Canada; manuscripts from all other places were sent to the Editor of the Association for the Study of Animal Behaviour ("British" Editor). Through a joint agreement, all manuscripts originating in the Americas (North, Central and South America, including Caribbean islands and Bermuda) should now be sent to the "American" Editor and all manuscripts originating elsewhere should be sent to the "British" Editor. The change is actually a minor one because relatively few manuscripts originate in the Western hemisphere outside of United States and Canada. The areas producing the most manuscripts affected by this change are the Organization of Tropical Studies (Costa Rica), Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute (Panama Canal Zone), Bermuda, Puerto Rico, Jamaica and Trinidad. Manuscripts addressed to the incorrect editor will be forwarded by him to the other editor, as has been past policy. PERMISSION TO REPRINT FROM ANIMAL BEHAVIOUR.-- I have been receiving an increasing number of requests for permission to reprint papers or parts of papers that appeared in Animal Behaviour. Those planning books of readings or other projects requiring such reprinting should note that our sister society, the Association for the Study of Animal Behaviour, owns the copyright on Animal Behaviour so that legal releases must come from A.S.A.B. Write to the English editor, Dr. Richard Dawkins, Department of Zoology, South Parks Road, Oxford OX1 3PS, England. The policy of the Animal Behavior Society has been one of "no objection" to reprinting of material from Animal Behaviour. However, would-be reprinters are strongly urged to make known to the original authors the intention of reprinting, even though the authors have no legal say in the matter. It is also a courtesy to provide each author whose material is reprinted with a copy of the book in which his material appears.--Jack P. Hailman.
